- Now that we've worked our way through all of Exodus, let's take some time to pull together what we've learned.
- What circumstances did God use to multiply Israel from a family into a nation (see 1:1–7; 12:38)?
- What steps did the Lord take to change Israel from human slaves to divine servants?
- What do you learn about human nature from the Israelites, Egyptians, and Moses?
- How did Moses' forty years of keeping sheep help prepare him to follow the Lord and lead Israel through the wilderness? (Think of both practical and spiritual ways.)
- Over the course of this book how did God transform Israel's understanding of His own character and holiness?
- What attributes of His being did God reveal to the people of Israel?
- What signs of spiritual growth, if any, does Israel show by the end of Exodus?
- How does what Exodus teaches about the Lord compare with the way the Gospels portray Jesus?
- What are some ways in which Exodus helps you understand the work of Jesus?
- How are the Ten Commandments relevant to Christians today?
- What do you feel was the most significant thing you learned from your study of Exodus?
